## Service Day Projects

Here is an outline of projects that will be completed at the Spring Service Day:

- Repaint the 'Camp Shands' on the basketball court
- Deep cleaning of the dining hall
- Add additional bollards to the landing zone and paint them
- Cut down dead trees around camp
- Trim overgrown brush
- Install roofing at Bathhouse A
- Tear off shingles on Bathhouse B

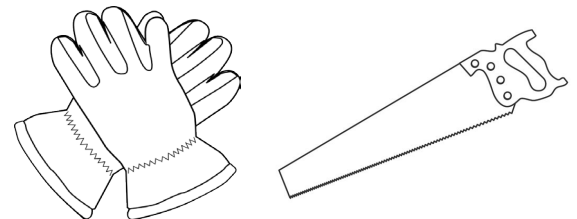
